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Features and Criteria





API Features

- The development of integration infrastructure is a tool for sustainable economic, social and environmental development.
- The Agenda is made up of projects –which may be national, binational or multinational– with a high impact on the physical integration of the region.
- The twelve countries are represented, and there is a balance in the number of projects promoted by each of them.



API Features

- The projects are selected by consensus on the basis of predefined criteria.
- The projects seek that the increase in the different transportation modes be viable and suitable.



API Features

 The priority projects may be supported by actions in the regulatory and territorial planning fields, creating a Territorial Integration Program (PTI, in Spanish).

A selection will be made of ongoing projects included in AIC (Implementation Agenda Based on Consensus 1) to add them to API, provided that they meet the criteria applied to the API.

Criteria for the Selection of Priority Projects

- 1. Projects must belong to the COSIPLAN Project Portfolio, be a priority in government action, be supported by the commitment to accomplish them (which is evidenced by the allocation of funds through multi-year financing programs, by the legislation passed, the budget measures taken, etc.).
- 2. Feasibility studies must be available, or the country has allocated the necessary funds for their implementation.
- 3. They strengthen connectivity networks that are regional in scope, and involve cross-border synergies.
- 4. There exists an opportunity or a need to take complementary actions intended to promote efficient service provision and the sustainable development of the territory, according to the characteristics and modality of each specific project.

Significance and Characteristics of the Project

- Brief overview of the main elements of the project, especially of its expected benefits and of its mid-term potential (in terms of both production and integration).
- How this potential scenario compares to the current status.



Does It Meet the Selection Criteria?

1. Evidence that the project is a priority in government action.

Is it included in development plans? national laws? Is there a broad consensus on the project?



Does It Meet the Selection Criteria?

2. Are feasibility studies available?

Breadth and detail of the available studies



Feasibility Study

- Highlight the main costs and benefits identified by the feasibility study.
- What the risks of the project are environmental, economic, social, technical, financial.

Does It Meet the Selection Criteria?

3. Does it strengthen networks with a regional scope?

Does the project/program include regional integration and connectivity elements?

What is its synergy with other cross-border projects? Is specific coordination required?



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Regional Networks

- Specify whether other countries are required to make any investment to supplement the amount invested in this project.
- Does the project make sense in the absence of supplementary investments?
- Is there any agreement to make such investments?

Does It Meet the Selection Criteria?

- Does It Require a Program of Complementary Actions? (Territorial Integration Program – PTI)
- Infrastructure (Border Crossing)
- Legal and regulatory aspects
- Environment protection and preservation EASE
- Production chains
- Border crossing facilitation

Towards the Development of API





API (2012-2016)

- Development of the Agenda (2011) Consensual selection of the projects based on the update of COSIPLAN Project Portfolio.
- Diagnostic study, implementation and monitoring of the Agenda (2012-2016)
 Diagnostic study of the projects, preparation of programs associated with them, and project implementation. Assessment of API in five years and ongoing monitoring.

- 5. Consolidation of API by IIRSA National Coordinators (XVIII Meeting of National Coordinators August 2011)
- 6. Approval of API by COSIPLAN (II Meeting of COSIPLAN November 2011)

- Analysis of all the priority projects involving the country that were presented at the GTE, including the following:
 - 1. Dialogue with the sectors/government agencies involved so as to reach <u>domestic consensus</u>
 - 2. Consultation with neighboring country/countries in order to reach preliminary agreements

Proposal containing the priority projects identified by each country for their inclusion into the API



4- Definition of the Integration Priority Project Agenda - API (GTE Meeting - July 2011)

Actions

- 1. Consensual selection of the priority projects to be included in the Agenda. Background information:

- 2. Preparation of a technical file for each selected project (in each country)

Outputs

- List of the priority projects selected by consensus
- Technical file for each priority project
